2020 Stewardship

Recovery! is our Stewardship theme for this autumn. It signifies where we are as we move beyond the initial crisis of the coronavirus pandemic into the ways we have changed our lives. For the first time in Covenant history we were closed three months; yet, still we found ways to express our love. With "Happy Boxes" and "Friday Meals" we reached out to our membership and neighbors expressing our care.

But we are still adjusting. In fact, all of us are - children in schools, parents monitoring on-line learning at home, mask wearing, visiting limitations to our family members in nursing home and hospital, our church nursery school is closed, and more. It may not feel like it; but a recovery is happening!

The account from the Gospel of John is a story of healing and recovery. A man, long ill, had succumbed to a popular superstition that if he could enter the water after the surface was disturbed, he would be healed. But the man becomes a caricature of hope, a joke. He can't get into the water because he can't walk. Into this scene, Jesus arrives and offers what the pool can't. Jesus heals the man; and, in recovery, he can return home to live a normal but entirely new life.

Jesus still heals today. He looks to us to offer hope and care to each other and to those outside our faith community

The recovery continues. We are asking you to pledge promise for the coming budget year. In fact, to increase your pledge promise if you can. Covenant has a job to do for young and old. Our pledge goal is a pledge increase of 10% overall or ten dollars a week. We hope you attempt the effort. Only you know your finances. If you can't match that goal, know that whatever you give will help us meet the challenge of recovery. God bless you!

The church internet service has slowed considerably. While it has never been fast, we live with it. To upgrade it would increase the cost of the monthly bill from Spectrum considerably. In fact, the internet plan we have is no longer offered; but we have been 'grandfathered in.'

Now, the internet service crawls between the hours of 11:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. I wonder if this is because internet use has increased with the remote school learning or home school learning that is happening as a result of the pandemic . . .

I, who have no connection to public school, am affected, too. Online orders for church supplies, information searches for church reopening ideas, and email prove frustrating as my computer indicates that the website I am seeking is unavailable or it indicates that the router in the church isn't working. Which in fact, it is. If I do my on-line work before 10 a.m. or after 4 p.m., I experience no problems whatsoever.

So, I've changed my work habits. It isn't convenient, but it is less frustrating and more productive. I imagine, at some point, the subtle anxiety from this intentional adjustment will disappear as the changes to my patterns become routine as did earlier ones.

Covenant is experiencing these changes, too, as we adjust what we do and how we do it. Some things did not and will not return this fall, like Jubilee or our nursery school, or our Children's Christmas Eve Service! Communion is different with our 'little prefab' cups. Coffee hour is indoors, but we constantly adjust our masks eating our individually wrapped cookies or sip our coffee. Meetings are held in our Fireplace room as we social distance. Some of these changes lack convenience, some provoke a feelings of loss. All are necessary, but the adjustment makes us feel conflicted.

Still we believe that what we do as a church supersedes these changes. Our faith in our mission as a church transcends these minor changes. Yes, minor! Imagine if we couldn't meet - as happened from mid-March to the end of June. But we can meet, and our mission goes on as we attempt to be signs of God's unconditional love to others. This sense of mission, this direction of our church life, moves us to make the adjustments that are necessary because love, in the end, is what Covenant is about.
